



# Biomedicine - Special prizes

- **Criteria and weighting**

Only the scientific production generated during the predoctoral period and relating to the doctoral thesis will be evaluated.

- European or International Doctorate
- Number of indexed publications derived from the thesis. Weighting based on order of authorship and the quartile of the journal.
- Patent applications.
- Periods spent in international research groups.
- Other publications.
- Participation in international conferences.
- Grants obtained through competitive competitions
- Prizes and others merits.

The academic committee may request a 15 minute interview with any of the candidates in order to obtain additional information to assist in the selection process. Candidates that the academic committee wishes to interview will be informed in advance so they can prepare a presentation in which they demonstrate the scientific benefits resulting from their doctoral theses.

The weighting of the different elements in the final evaluation is as follows:

- Number of indexed publications derived from the thesis. Weighting based on the position occupied by the candidate in the order of authorship and the quartile of the journal. (50%)
- European or international doctorate and periods spent in international research groups. (20%)
- Patent applications or licences (15%)
- Others aspects, including a possible interview (15%)

- **Required complementary documentation**

Candidates must present curriculum vitae that provide full information on the publications relating to their theses (quartile of the indexed journal, the impact index, year of publication, name of the journal, position of authorship, etc.) If the thesis was not published as a series of articles, the candidate must indicate which articles are related to the thesis.
